The mentoring program provides one-on-one mentoring to youth within their program. The goal of the program is to divert and empower youth in the juvenile justice system through the development of strong, positive relationships with caring adults to lessen the likelihood of failure and relapse. The Release Homes are two transitional living homes for youth at-risk of recidivism. Such youth can reside in these homes while transitioning from the Juvenile Justice System to society.
